Thank you for recognizing that the Desert-Wise Living Series is a valuable tool that inspires the public to become active participants in meeting the State's residential water conservation target.

The 2019 Desert-Wise Landscape Tour (9th Annual Tour) was held April 27 and 28, 2019. The 2019 DWLs also included an "Energy Conference" held January 26th and we will host Mr. Tom McCarthy, General Manager Mojave Water Agency at our fall event scheduled for September 28th. The DWLs is enabled by the continued fiscal contributions from our sponsors: Morongo Basin's water agencies, the Mojave Water Agency, Southern California Edison, Yucca Valley's Unique Nursery and Morongo Valley's Cactus Mart.

MBCA hosts the DWLs utilizing dozens of local volunteer's so the sponsorship funding is primarily utilized on advertising and preparation and publication of the tour guidebook. As always, the Tour is advertised locally through news print, radio ads, social media, local outreach events (i.e. Yucca Valley Earth Day) as well as our email contacts which exceed 1,300 individuals.

This year the Tour registered 270 individuals who participated in the two-day event featuring 21 locations scattered throughout the Morongo Basin. Complementing the 3 new sites were popular repeats as well as sites that had been off the tour for at least a year or more. We recorded a total of 1,602 individual site visits with the average number of attendees per site of 76. While our attendance was lower this year MBCA is still very proud of the statistics generated.

Materials that have been presented include a copy of the tour program and our 2019 Tour Report which includes tour facts as well as the essay's submitted by the attendees wanting to win one of three Unique Nursery or Cactus Mart gift certificates.

MBCA does intend to hold the 10th Annual Landscape Tour but the date has not been determined and we are evaluating various formats for the event and welcome any and all feedback on how we can improve the Tour experience. We look forward to continuing our important partnership in this event.

SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF RESOLUTIONS CHANGING THE DISTRICT'S

GENERAL ELECTION FROM AN ALL-MAIL BALLOT ELECTION IN

AUGUST OF ODD-NUMBERED YEARS TO THE STATEWIDE

GENERAL ELECTION IN NOVEMBER OF EVEN-NUMBERED YEARS

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The California Voter Participation Rights Act (Elections Code §§ 14050 et seq.) prohibits special districts from holding their general Board elections on dates other than a statewide election date if voter turnout at previous general elections held on non-statewide election dates have resulted in at least 25% less voter turnout than the average voter turnout within the special district for the previous four statewide general elections (November 2012, 2014, 2016 and 2018). This requirement was enacted under SB 415, effective January 1, 2018, meaning elections held after that date are subject to this requirement. The Act allows a political subdivision to hold an election other than on a statewide election date if the political subdivision has adopted a plan to consolidate a future election with a statewide election not later than the November 8, 2022 statewide general election.

In 2009, a majority of the District's voters voted to conduct all future District general elections by all-mail ballot in accordance with Elections Code section 4104. Currently, the District's general elections are held by all-mail ballot in August of odd-numbered years. Historically, elections held by the District in odd-numbered years have resulted in turnouts more than 25% less than the average voter turnout in the District for the previous four statewide general elections. During the last District general election on August 27, 2019, approximately 18.3% percent of eligible District voters cast a ballot.

The San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters does not maintain District-specific voter turnout information from the previous four statewide general elections. However, they do have such information for voters in the City of Twentynine Palms. Since most District voters are also City voters, this is the best available indicator of District voter turnout at these four elections. According to County records, the City's average voter turnout for the previous four statewide general elections has been 61.5%.

The District's August, 2019 voter turnout number is at least 25% less than the best available four-statewide-election average number, (18.3%/61.5% = 30% - This

represents 70% less than the four-statewide-election average). Staff again notes that this figure does not include voter turnout in the unincorporated areas served by the District and there may have been somewhat higher turnout in these unincorporated areas. Nevertheless, Staff believes that the voter turnout gap is so large and the number of unincorporated voters too few to alter the legal conclusion that due to "low voter turnout" at the August, 2019 general election, SB 415 requires the District to consolidate its future general elections with a statewide election date.

To consolidate its future elections with a statewide election date, the District must follow the process set forth in Elections Code Section 10404. Section 10404 provides that the Board must adopt a resolution requiring that the election of governing body members be held on the same day as either a statewide election date. If adopted, the resolution must be submitted for approval to the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors at least 240 days before the next District general election date. The resolution would become operative upon the approval by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to Section 10404 of the Elections Code.

If the District adopts the resolution and it is approved by the County, there would be no August, 2021 all-mail ballot election. Rather, the next District general election would be held in November of 2022. Current Director terms which are scheduled to expire in 2021 would be extended to November, 2022. Similarly, terms of those recently-elected Directors which are scheduled to expire in 2023 would be extended to November, 2024. Directors elected to new terms in 2022, 2024 and in all future elections would serve standard four year terms.

Because the District currently holds all-mail elections in August, converting from its current process to a statewide election will technically require two separate resolutions:

- 1. Elections Code section 4003 provides that a District which has adopted an all-mail ballot procedure for conducting its general district elections pursuant to Elections Code Section 4104 may, by resolution of its Board, revoke this adoption of the all-mailed ballot procedure and consolidate its general election with the County election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of odd-numbered years. Section 4003 allows the District to change its election back to a precinct election without having to resubmit the question to the voters. However, under Section 4003, the District can only convert an all-mail election to the November election in odd-numbered years. Resolution No. 19-13 is for the purpose of converting from an all-mail election in August of odd-numbered years to a precinct election in November of odd-numbered years.
- 2. However, the transition is not yet complete because November of oddnumbered years is not a statewide election date. Therefore, under SB 415 as described above, the District is further required to change its election date to a statewide election date. Resolution No. 19-14 is for the

purpose of changing the District's general election date from November of odd-numbered years to the November election of even-numbered years.

If the District Board approves the attached resolutions, Resolution No. 19-13 converting the all-mail election to a precinct election will take effect immediately and Resolution No. 19-14 converting the election from November of odd-numbered years to a November of even-numbered years will be submitted to the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors for approval.

Fiscal Analysis

There are potential cost savings by moving the District's general election to a statewide election date because the County's costs in conducting an election throughout the County will be spread across many local agencies, reducing per-agency costs.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board adopt the attached resolutions changing the general election for District Board Members from the all-mail ballot election in August of odd-numbered years to the November election of odd-numbered years; and then changing the November odd-year election to the statewide general election in November of even-numbered years.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

YEARS TO THE ELECTION IN NOVEMBER OF ODDNUMBERED YEARS

WHEREAS, in August, 2009, Twentynine Palms Water District ("District") voters voted to conduct all future District general elections by all-mail ballot in accordance with Elections Code section 4104; and

WHEREAS, the District currently holds its general election on the last Tuesday of August in odd-numbered years by all-mail ballot; and

WHEREAS, Elections Code section 4003 authorizes the District Board of Directors to, by resolution, revoke the voters' adoption of an all-mail ballot general election and change its election to the established election date to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of odd-numbered years; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent and desire of the Governing Board of the District to change from an all-mail ballot general election held in August of odd-numbered years to a general election held within the County of San Bernardino on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of odd-numbered years, commencing with the November 2, 2021 election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the Twentynine Palms Water District as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. That the above recitals are adopted as true and correct.

Section 2. <u>District Election Date</u>. Commencing with the November 2, 2021 election, the date of the District's general district election shall be held on the first Tuesday after the First Monday in November of odd-numbered years. As a result, upon the effective date of this Resolution, the District's August, 2021 all-mail ballot general election will be cancelled.

<u>Section 3</u>. <u>Board Authorization</u>. The President is hereby authorized to take any and all actions, and execute any documents necessary, to submit this Resolution to and assist the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Bernardino in its review and approval of this Resolution.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Severability.</u> If any section, subsection, clause or phrase in this Resolution is for any reason held invalid, the validity of the remainder of this Resolution shall not be affected thereby. The Board hereby declares that it would have passed this Resolution and each section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases or the application thereof be held invalid.

Section 5. This Resolution shall become effective immediately.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SAN
BERNARDINO
TO APPROVE THIS RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 19-14, Twentynine Palms Water District ("District") holds its general election on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of November in odd-numbered years; and

WHEREAS, SB 415, effective January 1, 2018, provides that a public agency, including the District, cannot hold its general election on any date other than a statewide election date if holding an election on a non-statewide election date results in a "significant decrease in voter turnout," which is defined by SB 415 as at least 25 percent less than the average voter turnout within the public agency for the previous four statewide general elections; and

WHEREAS, the District's general election date is not a statewide election date and during the last District election on August 27, 2019, the District had at least 25 percent less than the average voter turnout within the District for the previous 4 statewide general elections vote in the District election; and

WHEREAS, in order to change its general election date, SB 415 requires the District to adopt a plan to change its general election date to the same day as the statewide general election, which is held in November of even-numbered years, or the statewide primary election, which is held in March of even-numbered years, and the District must change its general election date to one of these two statewide election dates no later than November 8, 2022; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections Code Section 1303(b), the Board must adopt a resolution changing its general election date and submit the resolution to the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Bernardino at least 240 days before the next District general election, and the resolution must be approved by the Board of Supervisors in order to change the District's election date; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent and desire of the Governing Board of the District to change its general election to the statewide general election, held in November of even-numbered years, to ensure compliance with SB 415.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the Twentynine Palms Water District as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. That the above recitals are adopted as true and correct.

<u>Section 2.</u> <u>District Election Date.</u> Commencing with the November, 2022 election, the date of the general district election shall be deemed to be the same date as the statewide general election each even-numbered year. As a result, upon the operative date of this Resolution, the District's November, 2021 general election will be cancelled.

Section 3. Change of Term. In accordance with the change of election date, the terms of office of those members of the Board shall be extended for a period of approximately 12 months. Pursuant to Elections Code Section 10404, Board members whose term commenced in December, 2017, will have their terms extended until November, 2022. Board members whose term commences in December, 2019 will have their terms extended to November, 2024. Board members elected to new terms in November, 2022 and in all future elections thereafter shall serve four-year terms.

<u>Section 4</u>. <u>Board Authorization</u>. The President is hereby authorized to take any and all actions, and execute any documents necessary, to submit this Resolution to and assist the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Bernardino in its review and approval of this Resolution.

Section 5. Severability If any section, subsection, clause or phrase in this Resolution is for any reason held invalid, the validity of the remainder of this Resolution shall not be affected thereby. The Board hereby declares that it would have passed this Resolution and each section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases or the application thereof be held invalid.

<u>Section 6.</u> That this Resolution shall become operative upon approval by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Bernardino.

5.1 Maintenance

Matt Shragge reported that the District responded to 58 Underground Service Alerts, had 0 water main leaks, 5 water meter leaks, 2 service line leaks, 0 fire hydrant repairs and 83 painted, performed 3 customer pressure checks, replaced 13 meters, replaced 10 customer gate valves, and installed 1 new service. 0 water waste inquiries were received. 713 work orders were generated and performed during the month. 548 AMI/AMR meters were installed in July, bringing the total to 1,089.

5.2 Water Quality

Mike Minatrea reported Water production was down 16.18% as compared to the same month in 2013. 47 routine and 6 special water were taken. All samples tested negative for Colilert. The fluoride variance of 3.0 mg/L will expire in 2023. All current wells meet the 2.0 mg/L standard variance set by the State Water Resource Control Board. Approximately 85,000,000 gallons of water was produced in the month of July.

5.4 General Manager

Mr. Kolisz was absent. Matt and Mike gave a presentation at Coachella Valley Water District for grant funding opportunities through the Department of Water Resources.
