BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

At the January 22, 2020, Board of Directors meeting, the Board directed staff to move forward with the process of changing the schedule of fees that the Ad hoc committee recommended. Schedule of fees include miscellaneous charges such as deposits, return check fees, after hour connection fees, etc. These fees are adopted pursuant to Government Code section 66018, and must meet an exemption from the definition of a "tax" under article XIII C, section 1(e) of the California constitution. They are usually exempt either as fees for services, or fees to cover the costs of regulatory activity such as issuing permits or performing inspections.

Due to the uncertainty of the COVID-19 pandemic, the process of changing these fees was put on hold until a later date. These fees can only be adopted after a public hearing is properly scheduled, advertised and conducted.

RECOMMENDATION

Direct staff to schedule a public hearing on December 16, 2020, and consider adopting new schedule of fees at this meeting.

SUBJECT: DISCUSSION OF DISTRICT'S CURRENT BI-MONTHLY BILLING

CYCLE AND CONSIDER CHANGE TO MONTHLY BILLING

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The District historically has billed our customers on a bi-monthly basis with all of the water meters being manually read once every other month. This method of reading the meters was largely due to reducing the cost of labor, fuel, and vehicle maintenance of manually reading the meters which would be doubled if all the water meters were read on a monthly basis.

With the installation of the Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) complete, the District can now consider changing our billing cycle to monthly from bi-monthly as water meters will be read automatically eliminating the high cost of manually performing this task. Some benefits to monthly billing are:

- Consistency for planning monthly home budgets
- Less fluctuation in billing amounts, especially after heavy water usage periods
- Monthly billing provides customers with more frequent and timely information. about their water usage. This benefits the customer in two ways:
 - o It allows customers to adjust their water usage habits if they feel they are using too much water
 - It allows customers to detect leaks sooner, reducing water usage and loss.

The change to monthly billing will have no effect on the cost of water per unit and the ready to serve fee that is structured on a two month period. The current ready to serve fee will be divided by two (2) and billed on a monthly basis. For example, the current bimonthly ready to serve fee, for a 5/8" water meter, is \$27.70 and will be \$13.85 per month if the District changes to monthly billing. There will be no change to the commodity (usage) charge.

The change to monthly billing will have financial impacts to the District. All costs associated with generating and mailing water bills will increase. These items include:

- Printing and preparation of regular water bills
- Printing and preparation of delinquent water bills

- · Postage to mail regular and delinquent bills
- Envelopes
- SB998 Policy printing and preparation
- Printing of door hangers

The estimated cost of these items are approximately \$3,100 per month or annual cost of \$37,200.

RECOMMENDATION

To consider the change to a monthly billing cycle and direct staff to bring this item back for adoption at a future Board of Directors meeting if so desired.

SUBJECT:

REVIEW AND DISCUSSION OF AN OPT-OUT POLICY FOR THE

DISTRICT'S ADVANCED METER INFRASTRUCTURE

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

In August of 2020, the District completed the installation of the Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) project. This project involves the replacement of all water meters in the District, and a conversion to a fixed radio reading system. The installation involved two components: the replacement of the manually read meter with an AMI capable water meter, and a radio transmission unit connected to the meter. To date, the District has received several requests from customers asking if they can opt-out from having this style of meter installed for their water service. The primary reasons that opt-outs have been requested are concerns over the radio frequency from the meter communication device. AMI uses a low-powered communication device to transmit hourly water usage information over a secure network. The communication device is a battery powered low frequency radio that transmits data throughout the course of the day. All AMI radio devices are required to meet Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Radio Frequency limits and the equipment being used by the District meet these requirements. Many agencies are moving towards automated readers for multiple reasons, including reduction in operations costs for meter reading, greater accuracy in water use billing, and the ability to assist property owners with water use management.

Earlier this year, the Board directed staff to develop a residential opt-out policy for consideration that would establish procedures and fees that would enable a customer to opt out from having a fixed radio read water meter.

Opt-Out Process

Single and multi-family residential customers that desire to opt-out will be required to fill out, sign and submit the Request and Agreement Form to opt-out of having an AMI meter for their property. Requests must be made by the property owner and will be reviewed by the billing department and authorized by the General Manager. Once approved, the AMI meter will be removed and replaced with a non-automated meter that will be read manually for the billing cycle.

AMI Opt-Out Fees

Fee structure for the program will include items such as, (a) removal of the newly installed meter and automated meter transmission unit, (b) the installation of a manual read meter, (c) penalty fees if the meter cannot be accessed, (d) manually reading the meter and entering the meter readings into the District's billing system, (e) opting back into the AMI program. Billing cycle costs were calculated based upon average estimates for staff time to mobilize and manually read the meter along with staff time to manually enter the read into the system. The cost to manually read the meter would be \$25 per billing cycle which would be added to the regular scheduled water bill. There would also be a one-time setup fee up to \$65 due at installation. The cost breakdown are as follows:

AMI Opt-Out Set Up Charge

- One time installation and setup fee of \$65 to replace AMI meter with manual meter
- $_{\odot}$ If no AMI meter is installed then the charge will be reduced to \$15

AMI Billing Cycle Fee

Staff will manually read meter and manually enter data into the billing system accordingly to the billing cycle, for a fee of \$25 per billing cycle.

Penalty Fee

 If the meter cannot be accessed at the time of reading, an additional meter read fee of \$10 would be charged for each additional attempt to read the meter

AMI Opt-In

 If a customer desires to opt back into the AMI program, a fee of \$65 will be charged one time to convert the manually read meter to an AMI meter.

Customer Water Management

It is important to note that meters that are manually read will not have the water usage information uploaded into the District's data system, therefore the District will not have access to methods of analyzing usage data to assist the customer for water management. Also, the customer will not be subject to leak alerts or the customer portal once this is established.

Attached with this report is the draft "Request and Agreement" form.

Request and Agreement to Opt-Out of the Advanced Meter Infrastructure (AMI) and Radio Transmission Unit

The Twentynine Palms Water District (District) provides its customers a choice to optout of the Advanced Meter Infrastructure (AMI). The AMI Opt-Out allows for single and multiple family residential customers who voluntarily choose not to have the data collector/transmitter installed on their water meter. The program allows customers to have their meter read manually, according to the billing cycle, provided the customer pays the added cost of manual meter reading set up and monthly meter reading to the District.

If a customer chooses to opt out, the following charges will be added to your water bill:

An initial set-up fee of \$65.00;

1. <u>Presentation and Discussion of NBS Capital Impact Fees for New Service</u> Connections

Kim Boehler with NBS presented the Board with a breakdown of the District's current new service connection cost structure, in place since 2003. Changing Capital impact fees require a public hearing but does not fall under Prop 218 requirements to implement.

The Board unanimously agreed to bring this item back for further discussion at the November Board meeting.

2. <u>Discussion of NBS Rate Study Alternatives and Possible Action to Direct Staff to Begin the Prop 218 Process</u>

Staff recommends scheduling a public hearing and possible action to adopt one of the alternative rate increases, Alternative #1 - 8% or Alternative #2 - 10%, at the regular scheduled Board of Directors meeting on January 27, 2021.

Director Leazer made a motion to accept Alternative #2 - 10% and start the Prop 218 process, seconded by Director Horn, and approved unanimously by all present. Director Arthur was absent.

Staff recommends approving the proposal to provide a bid and construction services for equipping Well TP-2 in the amount of \$65,040 for the next phase.

Director Horn made a motion to accept the proposal from Engineering Resources of Southern California for bid and construction services for Well TP-2 in the amount of \$65,040, seconded by Director Coghill, and approved unanimously by all present. Director Arthur was absent.

5.1 Maintenance

Matt Shragge reported that the District responded to 77 Underground Service Alerts, had 1 water main leak, 0 water meter leaks, 0 service line leaks, 3 fire hydrant repairs/maintenance, installed 14 new services, replaced 9 customer gate valves, performed 7 leak audits, painted 0 fire hydrants, performed 7 customer pressure checks, replaced 3 meters Tested and exercised emergency generators and sounded wells for September. 0 water waste inquiries were received. 501 work orders were generated and performed during the month. There were no shut offs due to COVID-19. 15 AMI/AMR meters were installed.

5.2 Water Quality

Treatment/Production Superintendent Mike Minatrea was not available to give the report.

5.3 Finance

Ms. Byerrum reported revenues are at 23% due to summer water sales. 8,000 old meters were broken down and recycled for a \$35,000 profit. Expenses are trending at 17%. The Audit will be completed and presented at the December Board meeting.

5.4 General Manager

Mr. Kolisz reported the State Water Board approved the permit for Well 11-B without fluoride treatment, but with monitoring requirements. This

Friday the District will participate in a customer portal presentation by Pat Grady.

1. **ENGINEERING**

A. No items to report.

2. WATER QUALITY

- A. <u>Chlorine Levels</u>: Average levels maintained in the storage and distribution system ranged from a low of 0.07 mg/L to a high of 0.41 mg/L. Chlorination point (the point where chlorine is introduced into the distribution system) averages ranged from 0.15 mg/L to .75 mg/L.
- B. <u>Bacteria Samples:</u> A total of 38 routine bacteria samples were collected at test points for the storage and distribution system during this past month. In addition 11 special bacteria samples were collected. All routine and special samples indicated ABSENT for Colilert.
- C. <u>Fluoride Samples</u>: A total of 15 fluoride samples were collected at established test points for the storage and distribution system, and 7 fluoride samples were taken from potable water production wells. Fluoride levels in the distribution system ranged from a low of .85 mg/L to a high of 1.7 mg/L. Fluoride measurements collected at the wells ranged from a low of 0.35 to a high of 1.6 mg/L.
 - *Current fluoride variance of 3.0 mg/L expires in 2023.
- D. <u>General Physical:</u> A total of 10 general physical samples were collected from established locations as a part of routine testing requirements. Levels reported for color are <3.0, 1 for threshold odor and <0.1-0.3 for turbidity.</p>
