UPDATES

BACKGROUND

In 2014, California became the first state in the nation to develop and set a drinking water standard with a Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for hexavalent chromium (Cr6) at 10 parts per billion (ppb). In 2017, the Superior Court struck down the original Cr6 MCL, finding that the State failed to effectively evaluate economic feasibility when setting the MCL for Cr6 in drinking water.

Currently the California MCL for total chromium, which is the combined total of trivalent chromium (Cr3) and hexavalent chromium (Cr6), is 50 parts per million (ppm). The District's water supply does meet all current standards for total chromium.

With the proposed Cr6 MCL lurking around the corner, small water agencies throughout California including Twentynine Palms Water District and neighboring agencies look to take a tremendous financial burden on developing treatment processes or shutting down production wells.

Before you today is Ortega Strategies Group (OSG) for an updated discussion on hexavalent chromium and some legislative affairs that the District is currently taking part in.

Re: Twentynine Palms Water District Comment Letter Concerning the Proposed Hexavalent Chromium Maximum Contaminant Level

Dear Board Members and Staff:

Twentynine Palms Water District (TPWD) appreciates the opportunity to submit comments to the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) regarding the proposed Hexavalent Chromium (Cr(VI)) maximum contaminant level (MCL). TPWD is an independent special district in Twentynine Palms that serves 18,000 residents, of which 100% are residing in a disadvantaged community and 75% are considered severely disadvantaged. Our district, which prides itself on providing our community with affordable and safe drinking water, will see our mission severely impacted by the proposed MCL.

Comment 1: Re-evaluate cost impacts and economic feasibility of the proposed Cr(VI) MCL

While TPWD appreciates the work the State Water Board has put into addressing and calculating economic feasibility and impacts to water systems statewide and respects the processes in place to do so, the estimated costs outlined in the ISOR is not wholly representative of the systems that will be impacted. The ISOR states that:

"...estimated total statewide annualized costs for routine monitoring are approximately \$272,741, \$60,598, \$22,174, and \$20,208...total estimated statewide annual costs for increased monitoring are approximately \$129,582, \$22,645, \$2,202 and \$3,145... estimated total statewide annual costs for treated monitoring are approximately \$388, 747, \$67, 936, \$6,605, and \$9,436... " (Page 14, ISOR)

We understand the complexities that come with accurately calculating cost burdens for disadvantaged communities and small systems. However, at TPWD the costs mentioned above are not reflective of the actual costs that we will incur. These will have a significant impact on the administrative and technical capacities of the staff as well as the rates of the customers the District serves.

With our service area already classified as disadvantaged, keeping costs down is paramount to fulfilling the Human Right to Water (HR2W). We believe the methods used in the draft ISOR underestimate the actual costs that will be incurred by our district and passed on to our consumers and will hinder our pursuit of the HR2W. Instead of averaging households across the state, narrowing that average to just households affected in public water systems by the proposed MCL would more accurately reflect the burdens that disadvantaged communities will bear as a direct result of the proposed MCL. In all likelihood, that average cost per household will be much higher than anticipated.

Particularly at TPWD, we will have a high amount of stranded costs as a result of this MCL. While we do have our own treatment plant and already treat naturally occurring arsenic and fluoride in our groundwater, the affected well that we would need to treat for hexavalent chromium is unable to be connected to the treatment plant and will therefore need to undergo its own independent treatment. That well, which serves a portion of our service area that has no easy access to an alternative source of drinking water, has had around \$1 million in recent investments to reinforce and stabilize the water supply. The cost of treatment stacked with the recent infrastructure costs already aligned with that well is likely to put a large, undue burden on all of our customers in our service area, many of which already struggle to keep up with their utility bills. If treatment costs exceed what is within our means or the means of State assistance, we may have to shut the well down entirely and find a new source of water for that portion of our service area. While citing the SAFER program as a source of available funding, the State Water Board has consistently failed to support proposed legislation that would require that it create financial and technical plans to support water systems that cannot afford the technologies required to treat newly regulated contaminants. With anticipated budget deficits in the State for the next few years, we are concerned that even the help that is slated to be offered will not be available and thus leave us with few options or resources to come into compliance.

The onus of these additional responsibilities placed on our district will have a significant impact on our water service and our community. We kindly ask staff to re-evaluate the treatment costs and underlying issues that may make treatment more expensive for systems and include these in a holistic view that is more appropriately inclusive of disadvantaged communities like ours; as well as to proactively plan for the financial support water systems in disadvantaged communities such as ours will need.

Comment 2: Consideration of existing and future drinking water regulation impacts compounding with the proposed Cr(VI) MCL.

With the Department of Drinking Water considering twelve additional drinking water related MCLs in the coming years, the cost of treatment for each contaminant compounding on each other may increase the burden placed on our customers. While we understand and heavily tout the importance of safe drinking water, we equally tout the importance of affordable drinking water. As each new regulation comes out, it places additional burdens on our

capacity to manage, treat and provide drinking water to our service area. At TPWD, we do not have the bandwidth to continually establish treatment for our water sources in differing capacities for the differing anticipated MCLs.

Our existing ion exchange treatment plant, which as previously mentioned treats naturally occurring arsenic and fluoride, was built with a \$1.7 million United States Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA) grant. We are thankful that this allows us to continually provide low cost water to our service area. Our existing treatment plant is unique and exists solely from the prior partnership we had with the US EPA, making it difficult and costly for us or similar water systems of our size to replicate on our own to come into compliance with future MCLs. With new regulations anticipated from both the State Water Board and the US EPA, we are concerned that implementing treatment plans year over year for the upcoming regulations will exhaust our financial and operational capacity.

Comment 3: The proposed compliance period is not feasible for all systems.

We commend the inclusion of a compliance period for this MCL and thank DDW for staggering compliance based on system size. However, we struggle to see how a maximum compliance period of four years would be possible to completely devise a plan, then construct and implement a treatment system. Inflation and supply chain issues present significant costs and wait time to secure materials, and the accelerated compliance period further strains our limited managerial and administrative capacity. Lengthening the proposed compliance period can assist systems, most importantly the smallest of them, to spread out both costs and time as the treatment plans are put into place and materials are secured. Having that additional time is invaluable to systems like TPWD that have little access to additional capital when serving a disadvantaged community.

We are grateful for the opportunity to submit these comments to the State Water Board on the proposed Cr(VI) MCL and appreciate their consideration as it is developed. Please direct any further questions or discussion to my contact at mshragge@29palmswater.org.

Dear State Water Resources Control Board:

The Community Water Systems Alliance (CWSA) appreciates the opportunity to submit comments on the proposed Hexavalent Chromium MCL. CWSA is an organization of water providers, from small to large, including special districts, cities, and mutual water companies. The Alliance is based on the concept of larger systems helping small and economically disadvantaged ones. Several members of CWSA, some of which serve disadvantaged or severely disadvantaged communities, will be significantly impacted by the proposed hexavalent chromium (hereafter Cr(VI)) regulation with a Maximum Contaminant Level of 10 micrograms per liter (μ /L).

First, we value the importance of the regulatory process for drinking water, that recognizes the importance of a sound scientific foundation, and puts an emphasis on public health, with due consideration of technological and economic feasibility. The Human Right to Water (HR2W) adds a further dimension to consider as the State adopts new policies, such as this drinking water regulation.

With that as a foundation, CWSA comments generally fall into three main categories:

- a) Affordability and Economic Feasibility
- b) Ability to Comply with the Regulation
- c) Regulatory Process Concerns

With funding from its members, CWSA contracted with leading national experts to independently assess the affordability impacts of the proposed regulation. A primary objective of this study was to identify what (if any) affordability gap would need to be filled with state funds to meet the state's HR2W policy of "clean, safe, affordable, and accessible" water. With the aid of our study, we offer a few comments, namely:

- 1. The State's analysis seemingly underestimates the affordability impacts of the regulation.
- 2. Showing estimated costs averaged across the entire state instead of just affected systems is irrelevant and misleading.

3. The Initial Statement of Reasons (ISOR) may understate treatment costs by assuming Reduction-Coagulation-Filtration for 98% of systems.

Closely related to aspects of the affordability and economic feasibility of the proposed regulation, CWSA has identified challenges that will arise as community water systems seek to comply with the regulation. Our comments include the following concerns:

- 4. The ISOR falls short in evaluating the full burden and feasibility of compliance (administrative, financial, and operational).
- 5. The State needs to reconsider the MCL together with the cumulative burden of existing and projected future drinking water regulations on community water systems (CWS).
- 6. The State must be ready and able to fulfill its commitment to provide sufficient funding support to achieve compliance for all Californians.
- 7. Compliance periods allowed will be insufficient for CWS of all sizes and should be lengthened.

One final comment relates to the regulatory process, and the critical importance of basing drinking water standards on up-to-date toxicological research, translated to a Public Health Goal set by the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA). We cannot predict what will come of the reevaluation of the hexavalent chromium PHG, but we know that a sizable body of research has accumulated since the PHG was established in 2011. Thus, we note with caution that:

8. The regulation presumes the outcome of the Public Health Goal review currently underway by OEHHA.

The Community Water Systems Alliance hopes our complete comments (attached) will prove helpful to the Division of Drinking Water and the State Water Resources Control Board in further consideration of regulating hexavalent chromium as a primary drinking water contaminant. Executive Summary

A Spotlight on Economic Feasibility and Affordability

California's proposed Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for Hexavalent Chromium (CrVI) is a focal point for how the State addresses "economic feasibility" and "affordability" in accordance with the provisions of its Safe Drinking Water Act (Act) and Human Right to Water (HR2W) legislation. The original CrVI MCL, which was initially approved in 2014, was struck down in Superior Court in 2017 based on the Judge's finding that the State failed to effectively evaluate economic feasibility, as required by the Act. A key tenant of the judge's ruling was that the State did not consider affordability in its determination of economic feasibility but rather equated economic feasibility to cost-benefit analysis.

The State Water Resource Control Board (SWRCB, or Board) subsequently has sought to clearly define and address the challenges associated with economic feasibility and affordability. Adopting the Board's terminology here, affordability reflects "the ability of a household to pay its own bill;" economic feasibility is defined by the State as "the ability of the general state population served by public water systems to pay for compliance to a drinking water standard" (SWRCB 2020, emphasis added).

Affordability Challenges for Drinking Water Regulations

Affordability and economic feasibility challenges for drinking water regulations stem from "economies of scale" that dominate water purification technologies (resulting in relatively high costs per unit of water in smaller systems), combined with the fact that a large proportion of Community Water Systems (CWS) serving the public have a relatively small number of households sharing the expense. Consequently, regulatory compliance costs typically are far greater on a per household basis in small CWS than in communities served by larger water systems.

Compliance cost estimates for the CrVI MCL reflect this reality. The Board estimates compliance for the proposed CrVI MCL will add an average of:

- \$96 per year to water bills for the 1.2 million households served by the 31 largest water systems (e.g., greater than 10,000 service connections) with CrVI above 10 ug/L.
- \$1.620 annually to the water bills for the 2,600 households residing in 62 impacted CWS with less than 100 service connections.

Given a considerable majority of the state's MCL-impacted households are served by relatively large water systems -- and thus face relatively modest water bill increases -- the Board determined the proposed rule is "economically feasible" (i.e., it considers the MCL affordable for the "general state population"). Nonetheless, the challenge remains that the proposed MCL may not be affordable for most households served by the state's many smaller CWS. The rule also may not be affordable for many lowand fixed-income households in larger systems.

Providing Targeted Financial Support

Recognizing that many households will face affordability challenges due to the regulation, the State's proposed rule includes a commitment of considerable financial support for those CWS that meet a suite of affordability-related criteria, drawn from the Board's 2022 Drinking Water Needs Assessment. The funding eligibility indicators include whether a CWS already has existing (pre Cr VI MCL) water bill burdens above certain thresholds, a history of chronic noncompliance, or a projected MCL-based water bill increase of \$30 or more per month per service connection (household).

Applying these funding criteria to its CWS-level compliance cost estimates, the Board estimates a total grant allocation of \$73 million per year, directed to the targeted CWS, will sufficiently address the affordability challenge for the households served by those systems. The Board asserts that providing grants amounting to \$73 million per year is well within the State's fiscal means, amounting to less than 9% of an existing pool of \$823 million the Board claims is available from a suite of water funding programs ("available state grant" as well as DWSRF principal forgiveness and SADW funding for FY 2022-2023 are stated as the sources of State funding available to tap in support of affordable compliance with the proposed MCL).

Questions Regarding the State's Affordability Analysis and Findings

The State's proposed approach is commendable in that it recognizes the need to offer considerable financial support to those CWS for which CrVI MCL compliance is projected to place economic hardships on the households served. Nonetheless, aspects of the Board's approach to the analysis, and related practical implications for sustaining the promised level of fiscal support and effectively administering the process, raise questions and concerns.

1. <u>Program Target Effectiveness</u>: Has the State properly identified those with serious affordability challenges, or are some systems and households in need being overlooked? Likewise, might the State's approach offer relief where there is a negligible affordability challenge?

The State's proposed criteria (metrics) and related benchmarks (cut-off levels) for assessing affordability also serve as the basis for identifying CWS that will receive state funding, and the level of that fiscal support. Our independent assessment of the State's occurrence and treatment cost dataset, in concert with relevant data compiled from the U.S. Census, reveals that the Board's approach – which is entirely focused on water systems – overlooks situations where *households* will likely face significant affordability challenges but are not served by a CWS the State has identified as in need.

Likewise, the State's approach funnels funds to some CWS that meet the Board's criteria for needing support, but that serve communities consisting of relatively affluent households for whom the increased water bills are likely to be quite affordable. The program can be improved to better identify and reach those in need, and avoid subsidizing those for whom affordability is not an issue.

2. Magnitude of the Funding Support Required and Available: Is the State's estimate of the level of fiscal support needed sufficient? And does the State have the fiscal wherewithal and readily accessible pathways for efficiently channeling sufficient monetary support to the CWS, communities, and households facing affordability challenges?

The State claims it can fully address the affordability challenge with \$73 million per year, which it notes is

only 9% of a large pool of \$823 million it claims is available for such purposes. The \$73 million per year may well be an underestimate of the financial support needed:

- (1) Costs of compliance may well be greater than the State's estimates, increasing both the number of CWS in need, and increasing the amount of fiscal assistance required per system;
- (2) Improving the target effectiveness of the program to include financial assistance to economically challenged *households* in CWS that do not meet the State's eligibility criteria, while also excluding otherwise eligible *systems* serving relatively affluent populations, increases the estimated need to \$110 million per year.

There also are concerns regarding the true level of overall funding available from which to draw monies for CrVI compliance support. It is not clear that \$823 million is available from the sources the Board specifies. Given prior commitments and the realities of periodic state and federal budget adjustments, it is not evident how much funding for CWS compliance support is realistically available.

Further, the funds will need to be distributed through a process that limits the administrative burden on small CWS and provides funds in a timely manner to ensure prompt compliance. And, providing the funds in a front-loaded manner – rather than based on annualized costs – will better ensure CWS have access to sufficient capital to acquire and install necessary treatment.

3. <u>Long-Term Sustainability of Fiscal Support:</u> Can the State ensure long-term continued fiscal support at the levels required to all those with affordability needs?

Public health protection requires sustained long-term efforts and expenditures to ensure compliance is maintained over the decades ahead. It is not evident that the State is fully committed – or will have the fiscal wherewithal – to continue providing the required financial support indefinitely into the future.

4. <u>Supporting Competing Needs:</u> Can the State assure that the demand for State funding supporting CrVI MCL compliance does not unduly divert its spending on infrastructure rehabilitation, other water quality regulations and programs, and other necessary investments that may provide greater health protection benefits to ratepayers?

There are many competing important water-related needs, prior commitments, and other demands for monies drawn from the pool of state-administered funds. Water systems across California face a daunting array of challenges and associated needs for fiscal and technical support. Among the many water supply issues competing for limited utility, state, and federal funds are infrastructure renewal, compliance with existing and anticipated new regulations (e.g., MCLs for PFAS), and water system resilience and supply reliability in the face of climate change, a likely reworking of Colorado River allocations, and seismic risks.

And, beyond drinking water systems, there are many additional water-related funding needs and priorities. These include managing stormwater and flood risks, nutrient and other wastewater discharge controls, fishery and ecosystem protection and restoration, agricultural irrigation, and others.

Conclusions

The proposed CrVI MCL provides an opportunity for the State to ensure drinking water-related public health protection for all Californians can be attained in an affordable and economically feasible manner. The proposed provision of state fiscal support to water systems is commendable. There are important concerns, however, that: (1) the level of fiscal support need is under-estimated and not as well targeted as desired, (2) the State may not have access to as much funding as it claims in the rulemaking package, (3) the funds can be provided to water systems in a timely and administratively streamlined manner, or (4) necessary levels of funding can be sustained over the coming decades, especially given the many competing demands for water-related investments and programs.

1. ENGINEERING

2. WATER QUALITY

- A. <u>Chlorine Levels</u>: Average levels maintained in the storage and distribution system ranged from a low of 0.08 mg/L to a high of 0.43 mg/L. Chlorination point (the point where chlorine is introduced into the distribution system) averages ranged from 0.02 mg/L to .75 mg/L.
- B. <u>Bacteria Samples:</u> A total of 40 routine bacteria samples were collected at test points for the storage and distribution system during this past month. In addition 11 special bacteria samples were collected. All routine and special samples indicated ABSENT for Colilert.
- C. <u>Fluoride Samples:</u> A total of 15 fluoride samples were collected at established test points for the storage and distribution system, and 11 fluoride samples were taken from potable water production wells. Fluoride levels in the distribution system ranged from a low of .78 mg/L to a high of 1.5 mg/L. Fluoride measurements collected at the wells ranged from a low of 0.72 to a high of 1.7 mg/L.
- D. <u>General Physical:</u> A total of 10 general physical samples were collected from established locations as a part of routine testing requirements. Levels reported for color are <3.0, 1 for threshold odor and <0.10- 0.41 for turbidity.</p>
