

NEW WATER RATES

MARCH 1, 2026

The Twentynine Palms Water District is considering a rate increase to cover rising inflation costs, CIP projects, and unfunded mandates. The Rate Study indicates a 7% increase ensures the District is able to provide safe and adequate supplies of water over the next five years. The increase will also allow the District to set aside funding for *Emergency Reserves* for an unexpected *well failure*. As District well infrastructure ages, it is not a matter of “if” something happens, but a matter of “when” a well will fail. The District is striving to be financially prepared when this happens. Rate payers can protest the proposed increase by attending upcoming Board meetings and/or submitting protest letters to the Board of Directors.
