

**RESOLUTION 26-06**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS  
OF THE TWENTYNINE PALMS WATER DISTRICT  
ADOPTING THE 2025 URBAN WATER MANAGEMENT PLAN  
AND WATER SHORTAGE CONTINGENCY PLAN**

**WHEREAS**, the California Urban Water Management Planning Act, Water Code section 10610 et seq. (Act), mandates that every urban water supplier—defined as a water supplier that either provides water for municipal purposes to more than 3,000 customers or supplies more than 3,000 acre-feet of water annually—prepare and adopt an updated Urban Water Management Plan (UWMP) at least once every five years; and

**WHEREAS**, Twentynine Palms Water District (TPWD) is required to update and electronically submit its 2025 UWMP to the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) by July 1, 2026; and

**WHEREAS**, the Water Conservation Act of 2009 (Wat. Code § 10608 et seq.), also referred to as SB X7-7, requires urban retail water suppliers to develop urban water use targets for 2015 and 2020 and to demonstrate compliance with those targets in their UWMPs; and

**WHEREAS**, TPWD, in accordance with the Act and SB X7-7, has prepared its 2025 UWMP and has undertaken certain agency coordination, public notice, public involvement and outreach, public comment, and other procedures in relation to its 2025 UWMP; and

**WHEREAS**, TPWD has prepared its 2025 UWMP with its own staff, with the assistance of consulting professionals, and in cooperation with other governmental agencies and has utilized and relied upon industry standards and the expertise of industry professionals in preparing its UWMP and has utilized and relied upon DWR's 2025 Urban Water Management Plan Guidebook; and

**WHEREAS**, California Water Code section 10632 requires urban water suppliers to prepare and adopt a Water Shortage Contingency Plan (WSCP) as part of its urban water management plan; and

**WHEREAS**, TPWD has prepared its 2025 WSCP consistent with the Act and DWR's 2025 Urban Water Management Plan Guidebook; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with Water Code section 10621(b), notice was sent to the county and cities within the service area which the District provides water supplies at least 60 days before the required public hearing on its 2025 UWMP and WSCP; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with Water Code section 10642 and Government Code section 6066, TPWD made its Draft 2025 UWMP and WSCP available for public inspection and caused to be published within the jurisdiction of the TPWD at least two notices of public hearing regarding the TPWD's 2025 UWMP and WSCP, which publication dates included May 13, 2026 and May 20, 2026.

**WHEREAS**, TPWD held its public hearing on May 27, 2026 in the Board Room of the TPWD, located at 72401 Hatch Road, Twentynine Palms, California, regarding its 2025 UWMP and WSCP, wherein, among other things, members of the public and other interested entities were provided with the opportunity to be heard in connection with the TPWD's 2025 UWMP and WSCP and the proposed adoption thereof; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the public hearing on the 2025 UWMP and WSCP TPWD encouraged the active involvement of diverse social, cultural, and economic elements of the population within the TPWD service area with regard to the preparation and adoption of the 2025 UWMP and WSCP; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors of TPWD has reviewed and considered the purposes and requirements of the Urban Water Management Planning Act and SB X7-7, the contents of the 2025 UWMP and WSCP, the documentation contained in the administrative record in support of the 2025 UWMP and WSCP, and all public and agency input received with regard to the 2025 UWMP and WSCP, and has determined that the factual analyses and conclusions set forth in the 2025 UWMP and WSCP are supported by substantial evidence

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the Twentynine Palms Water District as follows:

1. The Board of Directors of TPWD hereby approves and adopts its 2025 UWMP and WSCP and orders that they be filed with the Secretary of the Board.
2. The General Manager is hereby authorized and directed to include a copy of this Resolution in the 2025 UWMP and, in accordance with Water Code sections 10621(d) and 10644(a)(2), to electronically submit the 2025 UWMP and WSCP with DWR no later than July 1, 2026.
3. The General Manager is hereby authorized and directed, in accordance with Water Code section 10644(a)(1), the California State Library, and any city or county within which the TPWD provides water supplies within thirty (30) days of this adoption date.
4. The General Manager is hereby authorized and directed, in accordance with Water Code sections 10632(c) and 10645(a), to make the 2025 WSCP available to TPWD customers and to the county and cities within which TPWD provides water supplies no later than thirty (30) days after

adoption, and further to make the 2025 UWMP and WSCP available for public review during normal business hours no later than thirty (30) days after submitting the 2025 UWMP and WSCP with DWR.


5. The General Manager is hereby authorized and directed, in accordance with Water Code section 10635(c), to provide that portion of the 2025 UWMP prepared pursuant to Water Code section 10635(a)-(b) to any city or county within which TPWD provides water supplies not later than sixty (60) days after submitting the 2025 UWMP and WSCP with DWR.
6. The General Manager is hereby authorized and directed to implement the 2025 WSCP in accordance with the Act and to provide recommendations to the Board of Directors of TPWD regarding the necessary budgets, procedures, rules, regulations, or further actions to carry out the effective and equitable implementation of the WSCP.
7. The Board of Directors finds and determines that this resolution is not subject to CEQA pursuant to Water Code Section 10652 because CEQA does not apply to the preparation and adoption, including addenda thereto, of a UWMP and WSCP and to the implementation a WSCP. Because this resolution comprises the Board of Director's adoption of its 2025 UWMP and WSCP, no CEQA review is required.
8. Pursuant to CEQA, the Board of Directors directs staff to file a Notice of Exemption with the San Bernardino County Clerk of the Board of Supervisors within five (5) working days of adoption of this resolution.
